SEPTEMBER:

Ongoing advice to members and businesses on VAT including updates through this blog post <u>Tax</u> & VAT advice and support for NHBF Members

NOVEMBER:

The NHBF responds to the Office for Tax Simplification (OTS) report reviewing the VAT system <u>The NHBF</u> backs calls for changes to VAT

SEPTEMBER:

NHBF takes part in a Ministerial roundtable to discuss the Taylor Review on modern working practices including VAT and self-employment

The NHBF calls for government action on VAT and National Insurance Contributions

JULY:

NHBF submits a formal response to the independent review of modern working practices, based on survey feedback from more than 500 sector businesses **Review of Modern Working Practices: The findings**

OCTOBER:

NHBF submission to the Chancellor ahead of the Autumn Statement on 22 November calling for a fairer system of VAT, either a reduced rate for the sector, increasing the threshold or introducing a smoothing mechanism around the VAT threshold. NHBF calls for support for beauty sector in autumn budget

JANUARY:

NHBF wrote to the Chancellor ahead of the Spring Budget in March 2023 called for an urgent review of VAT, either a reduced rate for the sector, increasing the threshold or introducing a smoothing mechanism around the VAT threshold. NHBF calls for further support from government ahead of spring budget

JANUARY:

Cut the VAT to 5% campaign with publication of the Pragmatix Advisory Ltd report on the impact of the pandemic on the sector: **Campaigning for you: VAT**

JUNE:

NHF (National Hairdressers Federation) at the time submission to the <u>Treasury Committee in Parliament</u> to their inquiry into VAT

NHBF survey to collect views for a government 'call for evidence' on VAT registration thresholds: NHBF members demand reform on VAT registration

Finance Bill introducing changes re the VAT liability of chair renters. NHBF met with HMRC in May to discuss our concerns and ran a seminar to explain the changes.

MARCH:

Cut the VAT campaign with HABIA, Fellowship of British Hairdressers, Federation of Freelance Hairdressers, Hair & Beauty Suppliers Association to lobby MPs, Ministers and HM Treasury officials with extensive media coverage and radio interviews.
